Homework

Please continue with the home learning packs throughout the year. Parents of year 4 children - your child will be given home learning packs during this half term. In addition to this, it would be beneficial to your child if you encouraged them to do the following each day (minimum five minutes per activity) read, practise spellings (in books). Each half term, children will also be given a themed homework task in preparation for the next topic. Additional English and Maths activities will be sent out if your child needs more practise.

Friendly reminder.

Please Can you ensure that your child brings their water bottle into school each day? It would be helpful if Forest School clothing could be left in school for the duration of Forest Schools (Six weeks per term). As the weather is turning colder, children should have coats in school at all times.

Reading

Children will read once a week (to an adult or an older child), take part in a guided reading session once a week, access Bug Club, partake in shared reading (in literacy and across the curriculum) and complete reading comprehension activities. Children should be reading to an adult for at least five minutes each day. **Please can you make sure you write in the reading record book so that we know where your child has got up to or if there is something they need to focus on?**

English

This half term we will be reading 'The Magic and the Mummy' by Terry Deary. We will be writing a letter to the pharaoh explaining the process of mummification. We will also be writing prayer poems, which were entwined into the bandages of mummies during Egyptian times.

Science

Our topic for Science this half term is animals, including humans. Children will learn about healthy eating, what types of food they should be eating in order to gain the most nutritional value and how the digestive system works.

ICT

Children will continue to learn how to create algorithms and explain how they work using logical reasoning. They will be using precise instructions to make programmes and to detect and correct errors. As always, children will access iPads for educational purposes and will be reminded of e-safety.



Who were the Egyptians?

Forest School

Forest School will start this half term and will be on Monday mornings for six weeks. The children will be learning how to safely use tools and light fires. We will be sharing lots of stories around the fire and eating toasted marshmallows.

Mathematics

We will kick start this half term with multiplication – paying particular attention to recalling facts from the times tables relevant to your Child's year group:

Y2 – X2, X5, X10

Y3 – X3, X4, X8

Y4 – all remaining tables up to 12X12

Please help your child practise these at home. At the end of year 4, children should be able to instantly recall facts for ALL the times tables.

Themed Curriculum

This half term, children are learning about The Egyptians. We will be learning about mummification and how Egyptians lived. The children will also be creating their own mummies, making pyramids and Egyptian coffins.
