- Staff will also prepare spellings and tricky words resources in advance, which will be sent out for any class self-isolating.
- Staff will contact families/ pupils weekly by telephone to check on progress and wellbeing. Staff will expect to speak to pupils directly during this call.
- 1:1 support if your child receives 1:1 support and they are isolating, a more bespoke programme of support will be set up. This may include phone calls / video chats with your child's 1:1 support.

Please note: Further changes may be made to this plan over the coming weeks. Any changes will be communicated to parents. If parents are having difficulties accessing online learning, please contact school immediately so that alternative arrangements can be made.
