Personal, social and emotional development

As part of Leavening family...

- Demonstrate friendly behaviour, initiate conversations and form good relationships with peers and familiar adults
- Welcome values and praise
- Adapid behaviour to different evens and social situations



Communication and language

We will be...

- Listen to stories with increasing attention and recall
- Using why and how questions.
- Question why things happen

<u>At home:</u>

Enjoy sharing and retelling stories and rhymes. Recall past events that are significant to your family

Physical development

We will be...

- Focussing on our fine motor skills using pencil control, scissor, pincers and threading.
- During the week we will be using the school hall to develop our positional language along with traveling with confidence using the balancing equipment.

<u>At home:</u>

Use small construction toys to help with fine motor skills. Talk about how you keep fit and healthy.

Literacy

We will be...

- Listening and joining in with stories
- Learning all the Phase 1 phonic aspects
- Recognising familiar words an signs such as own name and advertising logos

<u>At home:</u>

Vary the types of genre you read. Enjoy some poems, magazines, posters and stories and non-fiction books

Mathematics

As mathematicians we will be...

- Using positional language
 Ordering two or three items by size
- Matching numeral and quantity correctly

<u>At home:</u>

Practice counting objects Notice and recognise numbers and shapes in the environment.

Expressive arts and

<u>design</u>

- We will be learning...
- To sing familiar songs (5 currant buns)
- Use various construction materials
- Engaged in imaginative role-play

<u>At home:</u>

Listen to a variety of different music genres. Build and construct with various toys.

Understanding the World

As investigators we will be ...

- Able to build an enclosure
- Can talk about some of the similarities and differences in relation to friends and family
- Know how to operate simple equipment
- At home:

Talk about and show lots of different technology, e.g. remote controls, iPads, light switches, CD plays.
