

KS2 Pupil Outcomes 2018

Results are for 11 Year 6 students.

In written tests (reading, mathematics and GPS), students achieve a 'scaled score' which ranges from 80 to 120.

- To achieve the expected standard, a student must achieve a scaled score of 100 or more.
- To achieve above the expected standard, a student must achieve a scaled score of 110 or more.

- The calculating of 'Value Added' nationally ensures that average progress is 0.
- N.B- In 2018, the Government's Progress Floor target for KS2 is at least 65 per cent of pupils meeting the expected standard in reading, writing and maths combined at Key Stage 2.
The required progress scores are -5 in reading, 1 5 in maths and -7 in writing.

Interpreting progress scores

Progress scores will be centred around 0, with most schools within the range of -5 to +5

- A score of 0 means pupils in this school on average do about as well at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A positive score means pupils in this school on average do better at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- A negative score means pupils in this school on average do worse at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.

A negative score does not mean that pupils did not make any progress, rather it means that they made less progress than other pupils nationally with similar starting points.

Small schools, such as us, take individual pupil data in to account when carrying out our own analysis as data may not be reliable with small cohorts.
