Art and Design

We will explore what a story is and discover how some books are more than special because they are considered to be sacred or holy. We will discover about sacred books such as the Bible, the Holy Qur'an, and the Torah. We will also explore stories that are sacred to Muslims, Jews and Christians such as 'David and Goliath' and the story of 'Rama and Sita.'

As scientists we will look at animal young and compare them to their adults. They will study how animals change as they grow up. We will learn about the three basic needs of animals for survival (water, food and air). We will also children look at healthy lifestyles, including the importance of exercise, healthy eating and hygiene, including the importance oral health.
