#### Dear Parents,

The children have made a fantastic start to the new academic year, especially our new class members- well done! Our topic for this half term is '**Blood, Bottoms and Burps: The Amazing Human Body'**. The children have already had their 'launch day' where they enjoyed exploring jobs in the medical profession and activities focusing on what goes on inside our bodies. So, there is a strong emphasis on Science, and as well as History this half term. On the 'landing' day for the topic, before the half term break, the children will have the opportunity to take part in children's first aid training and awarded a first aid certificate. We are also very much looking forward to our residential trip to Peat Rigg in early October!
