Make a vehicle for a superhero/villain out of junk modelling materials. Remember to give it some special features and a name!

Wanted!

Make a wanted poster for a villain. It might be a villain you have read about in a book or comic or one that you have invented. You might like to design this using the computer.

Get Physical

Superheroes need to be super fit! Design an obstacle course or set challenges (such as star jumps, push-ups, lunges) for yourself and your family to do against the clock. Can you make a table of your results to show how many each person managed to do? Or you might like to perform a superhero dance. Think about how your superhero might move (e.g. quickly, slowly, spinning, weaving, leaping, dodging, flying, or climbing).

Get Creative

You might like to design and create a comic strip. Or you could sketch or paint someone that you think is a hero. You might also like to make a set of 'Top Trump' cards for heroes and villains, including their name, picture and strengthens and weaknesses. Don't forget to include their scores and ratings too!
