The children will also have the opportunity to observe first-hand, the hatching of chicks and monitor their growth (thanks to the Hawes family).

During the Geography topic, children will be out and about **exploring the local area** whilst developing their map reading and orienteering skills.

Our craft morning will be a fantastic opportunity for families to get together in school to create a special piece of work to be sold at our Easter Fayre.

Finally, our topic ends with a visit to Yorkshire Wildlife Park!

As **computer scientists**, we will be learning about animation. Our objectives are:

• To discuss what makes a good animated film or cartoon. • To learn how animations are created by hand. • To find out how animation can be created in a similar way using the computer. • To learn about onion skinning in animation. • To add backgrounds and sounds to animations. • To be introduced to 'stop motion' animation. • To share animation on the class display board and by blogging.

'It's a Wonderful World' Curriculum Overview

Science

As Scientists, we will be studying plants and growth. We will be investigating the key questions:
What do plants need to grow healthily?
What are the parts of a plant and their function?
How is water transported in plants?
What are the reproductive parts of a plant (Y5/6)

will be designing,

Humanities

Our focus this half term is on Geography and as Geographers, we will be developing our map reading and orienteering skills through field studies.

English

As readers, we will be enjoying texts connected to our topic, and our subject areas. Our Class novel is Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo - a dazzling adventure, where the main character Michael, experiences both the wonder and harshness of our world.

As writers, we will be learning how to write diary entries from the perspective of Michael in Kensuke's Kingdom.

As poets, we will be learning how to write **Kennings**.

In non-fiction we will be looking at the features of **non-chronological reports** and writing our own based on our Science topic of Plants.

Mathematics

As mathematicians, we will be focusing on:

Year 3 and 4: measuring length, perimeter, area and fractions.

Year 5 and 6: decimals and percentages, measures, area and perimeter.

.Practising multiplication tables and related divisions.

RE

In RE, we will look at the key question: why are festivals important to religious communities?

Music

As musicians, we will focus on the songs for our Young Voices performance finally set to go ahead on Friday 13th May! Listening skills will be developed exploring the wide variety of music we have been challenged to prepare, increasing our musical vocabulary and also developing our abilities to use our inner ears. We will use our inner ear and musical memory to recall all the songs. We will develop our performance skills – singing with accuracy of pitch, attention to dynamics and phrasing and interpreting the songs through actions. Children are strongly encouraged to practise the songs at home as there is a huge amount still to secure off by heart – use either the My Classmate app or Young

Voices Music Room.

French

As French linguists we will continue to learn all about animals. Year 3 will focus on Jungle animals, whilst Year 4 will explore Pets. Year 5 will be working on animals linked to the zoo and Year 6 will be considering a variety of animals allowing them to describe habitats of animals. We will all be developing our writing skills and we will be using a range of adjectives in French. We will endeavour to continue to secure our understanding of adjective placement. Year 5 and 6 will also use Perfect tense. We will be exploring French animal stories to develop our reading and inference skills. We hope to produce some simple French stories ourselves. Throughout the tasks we will be completing speaking, reading, listening and written activities.
