The New School Day

Thank you to those who are adhering and adapting to the new timings. This is making a big difference as children are gaining more learning time in the morning when they are at their most alert.

We will aim for all pupils to be in school for 8.45am

To recap:

School starts promptly at 8.45am and finishes at 3.15pm.

Pupils will be allowed into the school playground from 8.35am. The school bell will ring at 8.40am to enable pupils to come into school and settle for the day. Any pupils who arrive after 8.45am will be recorded as a late arrival. Staff will be on duty from 8.35am

Nursery opens at 8.55am and finishes at 3.10pm on a Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.

The nursery pupils are welcome to wait in the playground from 8.35am when the gate opens, particularly if they have siblings. However, parents and carers will be fully responsible for their child until a member of nursery collects them from the playground at 8.55am. Nursery children must be promptly collected at 3.10pm and again may wait in the playground, with their parent and carer until their siblings finish at 3.15pm.

Until last year the FOLs (Friends of Leavening School) has been an active fundraising registered committee who we have relied on for raising funds for school. At this meeting we would elect new committee members and discuss ideas for the years fundraising events. From this, we would then delegate roles to people. Any help, in any form is valued.
