How to Write a Good Story

Characters Who are the characters in your story?

Opening

Introduce the characters and

the location of the story.

Dilemma

Write about a problem that is

happening in your story. What is it that has gone wrong?

Closing

Bring everything in the story

to an end and make sure the

problem has been fixed.

Setting Where is your story set? Is it in a forest, a town, in the park or somewhere else?

Build-Up

Begin to write about what is happening at the start of your story. Don't forget to use the characters you introduced at the beginning of your story






Labels are a useful way of clearly identifying and describing what something is.


