More Junk Modelling Resources




PE on Mondays and Fridays


Library Books








Talk Through Stories This half term, we will be continuing to focus on tier 2 words that children don't generally use in their day to day conversations. We will be reading a different book every week and playing little games focussing on various key words. These are the front covers of the books we're going to read this half term. If you have these at home, it would be great if you could send them in for us to discuss with your child.







More Natural Resources

We're collecting natural resources to add to our outdoor area including shells, pebbles, pine cones, tree branch sections and wooden building blocks. If you have any of these spare, we would really appreciate them.

In English, your child will be writing a diary about what exciting things they've done over the Easter holidays. Following this, your child will also create an explanation text about how they can look after the environment in various ways. They will also create a poem describing the beautiful nature and wildlife using similes and metaphors to add imagery.

In maths, Reception children will be looking at numbers up to 20 and beyond. They will learn how to add and subtract objects and find the total too. Year 1 and 2 children will learn how to find fractions of amounts of objects and parts of shapes. Year 1 children will learn about multiplication and division by grouping and sharing. Finally, they will spend a short time learning about changing the position and direction of various shapes. Year 2 children will be learning how to tell the time to the nearest minute. In Science, your child will be exploring the parts of a plant and a tree. They will learn some names of some of the common garden and wild plants and also some names of common deciduous and evergreen trees. They will label the basic structure of a plant and a tree and find out the function of each part too. They will also predict which cress seeds will grow most successfully, then observe the growth and measure the height of the cress daily.

In History, your child will be discovering why Rosa Parks and Emily Davison are significant. They will be learning what are the similarities and differences between these two amazing people who lived in different time periods.

In computing, your child will use 2 Paint to draw an image of their plant to label and use 2G0 to complete some coding challenges. They will use 2Calculate to complete some challenges using spreadsheets.

In PE, Mrs Milson will be teaching your child the skills of Athletics activities on Monday afternoons. Mrs Bedford will be teaching your child the skills of rounders on Friday afternoons.

In Art and Design, your child will be creating a collage inspired by Henri Matisse. He's known for his colour and shape, and we will try to create a collage based on his artwork using a variety of materials.

In Music, Mrs Stockill will be helping your child to develop their skills as performers learning several well-known melodies on glockenspiels.

In French, Mrs Stockill will be asking the children to explore sports, and asking the children to continue to say what they like and dislike and, how to say what we play and do. The children will also reinforce the days of the week.



In Understanding the World and Religious Education, your child will be learning about what being special means and what it means to belong to a faith community. They will be focussing on Christian and Jewish people and how they celebrate their religions as a community.

In Personal, Social, Citizenship and Health Education we will be focussing on 'Relationships'.

In Reception the pupils will be learning knowledge and skills linked to:

Family life

Friendships

Breaking friendships

Falling out

Dealing with bullying

Being a good friend

In Year 1 and 2 pupils will be learning knowledge and skills linked to:

Different types of family

Physical contact boundaries

Friendship and conflict

Secrets

Trust and appreciation

Expressing appreciation for special relationships

Throughout our 'Picture News' curriculum we will explore current affairs that demonstrate the key British Values of:

respect for the rule of law

individual liberty

democracy

mutual respect for and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs.
