Dear families



PE/Forest School

We expect children to be coming to school in their **PE kit on Monday only**. Please can you ensure this is in line with our uniform policy. **Long hair** needs to be tied up.

Water bottles/snacks

Please ensure your child has a **named** water bottle in school on a daily basis. Children are able to bring a healthy snack for break timeplease fruit/veg only.

Times tables and spelling homework

Children are sent home new **spellings** to learn each week for their **test on Monday**. They will bring their red spelling book home with their new spellings stuck in (on Monday) and you will be able to see the scores from their tests in the back. Please help your child to also practise any incorrect spellings.

Children will also bring home a **times table** practise book. Please could you help them to learn these for their **test on a Friday**. They need to know these inside out, back to front and out of order! We do practise in school but the 'little and often' approach helps these to secure and embed their

knowledge/recall.

Maths and Topic homework

Each time your child completes a unit of work in Maths, they will bring a consolidation booklet home to practise the skills they have acquired. There will be a hand-in date written on the booklet.

Each half term , your child will be set topic homework related to the current Science and Humanities focus, to be submitted by the last Monday of each half term.

<u>Reading</u>

In class, children can choose a book from the class library to read for pleasure. They also have a reading book to read with an adult which is matched to their reading level - please read with your child at least three times a week to boost confidence and support progress with their reading skills. Children will gain a stamp on their reward card every time they do this. **Pop-up library** – this continues fortnightly on a Thursday. Please help your child to remember their book to change

Curriculum coverage for this half term

The following list outlines the area of the curriculum we will be studying for each subject. KO indicates that there is a knowledge organiser for this topic, where you can find additional details about the key information the children will be learning:

- Maths: Y3 Mass and Capacity, Fractions, Money Y4 Fractions, Decimals and Money Y5 Decimals and Percentages, Perimeter and Area, Statistics Y6 Shape, Position and Direction
- English: fiction writing an alternative ending to an adventure story; non-fiction persuasive writing -leaflets (KO)
- Science: Forces and Magnets (KO)
- **Computing**: Word Processing (KO)
- **Geography:** Magnificent Mountains(KO)
- **DT:** Sheet materials: designing and making a slingshot vehicle (KO)
- RE: Y3/4 children will be considering the question What does it mean to be a Christian in Britain today? (KO) Y5/6 children will be considering What difference does it make to believe in Ahimsa (harmlessness), Grace (the generosity of God), and Ummah (community)? (KO)
- PE: Rounders and Athletics
- **Music:** develop skills as performers learning to play recorder, using traditional notation (KO)
- French: learning how to say that we play and do different sports, and other hobbies (KO)
- PSCHE: We will be focussing on 'Relationships', particularly within the online world.
