



- Adjectives in French change depending on the gender and number of the noun that they describe.
- This means that they can have a masculine, feminine and/or plural spelling.
- The general rule for how adjectives change is explained in the table below.

	Masculine	Feminine
Singular	grand	grande
Plural	grands	grandes


