Dear Parents and Carers

We would like to thank families for their continued support with our school uniform expectations. We are writing to remind parents and carers about our PE uniform policy, as we have recently seen an increase in children attending school in leisurewear and clothing and accessories that do not meet our agreed expectations.

**Our PE uniform policy is as follows:**

Plain white T-shirt with or without school logo

Navy blue, black or grey PE joggers or shorts

Black pumps (for indoor PE) or black trainers if outside/good weather.

***On PE days, children should come to school in their PE kits.***

Please ensure all school uniform is **clearly named**. The lost property box is in the school reception area. ***Children are not allowed to wear jewellery (including earrings) make-up or nail varnish to school. Please make sure all children with long hair have their hair tied up.***

Please note that bright colours, branded leisurewear and non-uniform sports clothing are not permitted. Our uniform expectations are in place for several important reasons. A consistent PE kit promotes equality, reduces peer pressure linked to clothing choices, supports a sense of belonging and school identity, and ensures children are dressed appropriately and safely for physical activity.

As above, we would like to remind families that children should not wear earrings in school. This is for health and safety reasons, particularly during PE, active playtimes and sporting activities where earrings can easily become caught and cause injury. Guidance from the Association for Physical Education (afPE) advises that jewellery should be removed for physical activity to reduce avoidable risks.

If children arrive wearing earrings, they will be asked to remove them privately. If they are unable to do so independently, parents and carers may be contacted to support with this. Children wearing earrings will not be permitted to take part in physical activities, including PE and active playtimes.

We do recognise that, as a school, we are often viewed as having a relaxed and nurturing approach, which we value greatly. However, we also believe that maintaining clear and consistent standards around uniform and presentation is important in showing pride in our school, respect for our community and helping children to understand expectations and responsibility.
